Introduction

In March 2024 West Yorkshire Combined Authority commissioned the Workforce Development Trust (also known as Skills for Justice) to undertake a local evaluation of the Immediate Justice Pilot in West Yorkshire.

This short survey is part of that evaluation, intended to allow anyone with views on IJ a way to share their experiences - including, but not limited to:

- Adults taking part in unpaid work.
- Adults taking part in learning courses with Restorative Solutions.
- Those involved in Community Conferences.
- Children receiving support from Youth Justice Services though they may possibly need the help of an adult to complete the survey.
- Anyone involved in delivering the above (such as West Yorkshire Police, Probation, Restorative Solutions, Victim Support, or Local Authority).
- Victims.

The survey will take no more than 5 minutes to fill in, and is strictly anonymous. The information collected will not be used to identify any individual nor used for any purpose other than evaluating the IJ approach in West Yorkshire. No completed questionnaires will be seen by any outside agency beyond the research team and any identifying information will be pulled out prior to any reporting. Any collected data will be deleted at the closure of the evaluation period, no later than Aug 2024.
