



## Precept Consultation 2022/23 Final Results

The public consultation on the 2022/23 Council Tax police precept ran between the 6<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of January 2022. Residents were invited to respond to the proposal of a 4.7% increase, corresponding to 19 pence per week for a Band D property.

The consultation was promoted extensively online through the Mayor's and Deputy Mayor's Twitter and Facebook accounts, and circulated to partners to help to reach a wider audience. The consultation was also promoted through local media, with the Deputy Mayor interviewed by BBC Leeds as part of the programme of raising public awareness.

Other online, print, and radio media which promoted the opportunity for residents to take part in the consultation included the Bradford Telegraph & Argus, Keighley News, Halifax Courier, Sunrise Radio, the Huddersfield Times, and the Yorkshire Evening Post.

At the close of the survey, 2,377 residents had recorded their views on the precept, a 25% increase on the response to last year's consultation.

## **Headline results:**

## Residents were asked:

- Whether they supported the Mayor in continuing to secure the extra policing investment required in West Yorkshire Police to help make sure communities are safe, just, and inclusive; and.
- Whether they were happy to contribute the associated increase to their Council Tax (19p per week for a Band D property).
  - 72% of respondents supported the Mayor in continuing to secure the extra policing investment required in West Yorkshire Police to help make sure communities are safe, just and inclusive.
  - 62% of respondents supported the proposal to increase the precept by 4.7% in 2022/23
  - 46% of respondents were from Band A to C households, with Band D households the most frequent (24% of the total).
  - 59% of those in Bands A to C supported the precept increase, with 65% supporting the increase in Band D and above.

<sup>\*</sup> The consultation identified police officer recruitment and violence against women and girls as mayoral pledges, as well as tackling neighbourhood and violent crime, and supporting victims of crime as aspects of the Mayor's objectives for policing in the year ahead.
